#### **COMMENTS:**

This correspondence, if approved by the Board, would obligate the Agency to provide briefings to a public interest group for their general education on several complex technical topics.

Public interest groups have long been a part of the DNFSB's network. The Board consistently allows them to participate in the public comment portion of hearings, to provide their points of view through correspondence, and to visit in person with Board Members and members of the staff. The Atomic Energy Act (as Amended), the Code of Federal Regulations, and the Government in the Sunshine Act all mandate the Board to be open to the public in its operations where such openness does not compromise national security information.

That said, the mission of the Board, as specified in the Atomic Energy Act contains neither an explicit nor an implicit mandate to the Board's that its mission includes educating the public. The Board's mission is closely circumscribed by law: "... to provide independent analysis, advice, and recommendations to the Secretary of Energy to inform the Secretary, in the role of the Secretary as operator and regulator of the defense nuclear facilities of the Department of Energy, in providing adequate protection of public health and safety at such defense nuclear facilities."

Consequently, using staff resources, even though marginal in this instance, to educate a public interest group on complex technical Recommendations made to the Secretary is outside the Board's mission and is thus an inappropriate use of public resources. Likewise, providing educational services to a public interest group sets a precedent that the Board would be well-served to avoid.

I therefore disapprove.
